- Crisis Services

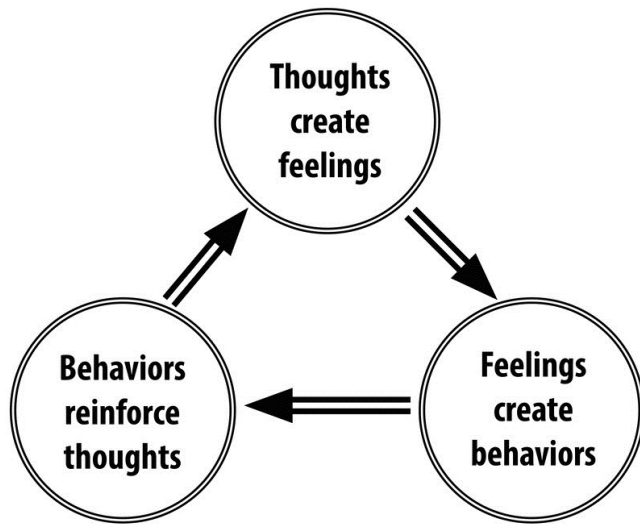

There is **HELP**. You are **NEVER** alone.

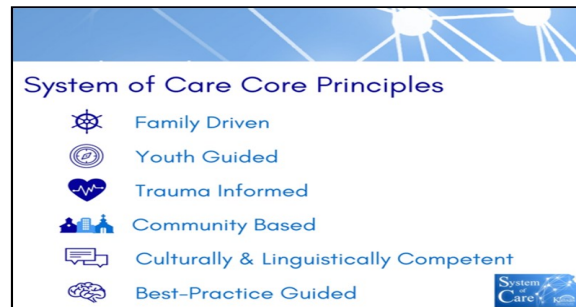
**OTHER SYSTEM OF CARE PROGRAMS / OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH AND FAMILY VOICE AND CHOICE:**

- ⇒ LOCAL ADVISORY COUNCIL
- ⇒ STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL
- ⇒ PARENT FOCUS GROUPS
- ⇒ PARENT NETWORKING GROUPS
- ⇒ YOUTH GROUPS (YLINK)



**PARTICIPATION / QUALIFIERS**

- System of Care services are for children and youth up to age 21.
- The child/ youth will need to have a qualifying diagnosis in an (SED) category.
- A CAFAS assessment with score between 50 - 100 (or a 30 in one area).
- Already been assessed for waiver and Medicaid services. SOC is the payer of last resort.
- Child / youth can benefit from short term support (up to one year) and has not received waiver services within the last year.
- Family participates in the research study to receive grant funding for services.
- Incentives are available to qualified families for participating in the study.



**PROGRAM FACTS**

SCMH can help identify a child's needs and qualification for services.

- ◆ Basic assessment, goal setting, treatment planning, and services identification.
- ◆ One on one child support worker.
  - ◆ Child participation in social emotional development groups.
  - ◆ Parent support consultation services in home or in community.
  - ◆ Access to parent education resources, classes, groups.
  - ◆ Respite group to give children and families a break from day to day stressors.
